

INTERNATIONAL VIDEO PRESELECTION

Dance Open America

November 10th, 11th, and 12th, 2023

We are delighted to welcome you to the International Video Preselection.

This event has been created for the dancers to be selected and receive their Golden Pass for the Dance Open America Grand Prix Finals in Miami April 25th - 28th of 2024.

Dancers will have the opportunity to work with extraordinary artists and receive scholarships awards, which will allow you to plan your summer ahead earlier in the season.

Registration is NOW OPEN!

Deadline for submitting your videos is October 1st, 2023.

General Information

- A participant's age for the Dance Open America International Preselection is determined as of November 10th, the date(s) of this competition. All other regional events & the Grand Prix Finals are determined as of January 1st, the year of the competition (2024).
- A competitor can compete with a school or as an independent.
- Professional dancers up to 24 years old are eligible only if they have had experience as a trainee, apprentice or corps de ballet.
- For the International Video Preselection any soloist dancer **must** present a **minimum of 2 solos** with at least **one being a classical routine**.
- All participants must take the master classes even if you are only in an Ensemble routine.
- Dancers will register through the DanceCompGenie system (link on our website) separately and will then submit videos via WeTransfer to <u>video@danceopenamerica.org</u>

Video Submission Requirements:

Please send videos to Video@danceopenamerica.org via WeTransfer. You do not need to create an account, but simply go to wetransfer.com and follow the prompts to enter the email address for the files to be sent free of charge.

- Only performance-quality recordings will be accepted.
- Video quality and formatting: Up to 1080p, anything below is also acceptable.
- Size: Up to 1GB, anything above that and the video clips must be uploaded in parts, or the quality should be reduced.
- Format: The following formats are supported: (.mov, .mp4, .m4v, .m2v, .avi, .mpg, .flv, .mwv, .webm, .ogv, .mxf, .asf, .vob, .mts)
- The videos sent via WeTransfer should include the following information: Participant/s name/s, age, School/Instructor Name and Work Titles.

- Dress Code: We encourage participants to wear the appropriate costume for the represented piece, however, if not possible please wear a color that will clearly contrast with your background. For ladies, pink tights, and a leotard, for men black or gray tights with a white T-shirt for men will be permitted (we will not accept any videos of a participant wearing warm-up clothing or leggings)
- By taking part in this competition, you (the competitor) waive all performance rights in case of television broadcasting and/or any recording during the competition.
- DOA reserves the right to use any photo or video recording of participants' performances during the contest for further promotional purposes.
- DOA does not pay royalties.
- Competitors must ensure that they have the right to perform both classical and contemporary works.
- Videos with logos of others competitons are NOT acceptable.

Divisions:

Classical and Contemporary Solos:

Rising: Age 8 to 10 years

Junior: Age 11 to 13 years

Teen: Age 14 to 16 years

Senior: Age 17 to 19 years

Professional: Age 20 to 24 years

All other categories (Duos/Trios Contemporary, Classical Pas de Deux, Ensembles: over 4 participants)

Pre-Competitive: Age 8 to 12 years

Intermediate: Age 13 to 16 years

Advanced: Age 17 to 24 years

The ages for Duos/Trios Contemporary, Classical Pas de Deux, Ensembles pieces will be averaged/combined between the ages of all participants. The category will depend on the result of this average. This will be divided among only three categories as labeled above:

PreCompetitive / Intermediate / Advanced

Dance Open America directors will determine, from the number of registered male competitors within an age division, whether or not males will compete with or separately from the females in a given category.

Maximum Performance Time Allotted:

Solos: 2:45 min

Pas de Deux: 6:00 min

Duo/Trios: 3:00 min

Ensemble (4-7 dancers): 4:00 min

Ensemble (8 + dancers): 5:00 min

Evaluation Process:

Each competitor will be judged independently in each style.

Each of the three (3) Judges will score in these 4 areas:

Artistic: 25 points total Technique: 25 points total Musicality: 25 points total Line: 25 points total

Maximum Total of Points per Judge: 100 points

Please note: The judges' scores are final and unappealable.

Scores:

There will be three (3) professional qualified judges at the competition. Each competitor will receive a score out of 300 possible points. To qualify for the Golden Pass, the competitor must receive a score of 270 or above.

Every performance is expected to be age appropriate and family friendly. Any routine that is considered by the judges to be inappropriate based upon dance moves, costumes, and/or music, will be subject to disqualification.

Awards:

FIRST PLACE: Gold Medal

SECOND PLACE: Silver Medal

THIRD PLACE: Bronze Medal

Dance Open America will announce "Top 15" in each division.

A dancer with two solos in either the classical or contemporary category will be considered for placement qualification and awards based on their higher scoring solo. For example, you would not be given both a Gold and Silver medal within the same category.

Master Class Auditions:

The aim of Dance Open America is to preserve the legacy of Classic Ballet and educate students about the art of ballet and to help prepare them to reach their full potential and dreams.

All competitors have the unique opportunity to participate in Master Class Auditions. We offer a fantastic opportunity for students to be observed by World renowned Artistic Directors, Choreographers and teachers in a variety of Dance Genres, from around the globe.

Reaching a high level of expertise. Students are selected during these classes for possible future Scholarships and company contracts. We allow students the opportunity to interact and get inspired through conversations with the stars.

Certificate of Achievement:

Each competitor will receive a CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT for their participation. In addition, a high score awards medal will be given to the top scores in each category within an age division. DOA reserves the right to limit awards based on number of entries in the category.

Competition Entry Fees:

Registration Fee: \$55 non-refundable

Include all masterclasses

Classical and Contemporary Solos: \$115 each

Classical Pas de Deux : \$65 (per dancer)

Ensembles: \$60 (per dancer)

WE MUST RECEIVE THE REGISTRATION FEE DEPOSIT OF \$55 per dancer, 45 days before the competition. The \$55 Registration fee is non-refundable.

All fees must be paid in full 4 weeks before the competition, October 1st, Discounts applied cannot be combined with any other offer. In the event that entries are received within 1 week of the competition, a \$10 per entry late fee will be added, only if the entries were able to be added to the schedule based on available space.

Payment may be made by credit card, or wire transfer. No personal or studio checks will be accepted. All fees are non-refundable.

No entry is guaranteed until payment has been processed. A confirmation email will be sent to each studio for their records and approval.

Please be sure to check that everything is correct.

Performing on Pointe:

We are strongly committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of all dancers, and especially of our youngest participants. Please make sure that you adhere to the guidelines set forth below:

Students Age 10 and under: We recommend performing in flat shoes.

Students Age 11 and older: We strongly encourage performing on pointe.

Teacher Credential:

When registering your dancers online, please be sure to list your Teacher and Director in the "Teacher" field of your registration process. If theater rules allow, we will distribute 2 Credentials per each school.

Due to each theater's security regulations, teachers / directors must provide a photo ID at the registration table located inside the theater. Please note that we will not be able to replace misplaced or stolen Credential.

Teachers and directors with their credentials will have access to participate in all master classes and open competitions. The competition schedule will be sent via email two weeks before the events.

Scholarship Offers:

Participants who receive scholarship offers or letters of interest/acceptance from Grand Prix Dance Open America should follow up directly with the contact information provided from the presenting school or company. We kindly ask participants to then inform our regional office once any offers have been formally accepted.

Videos and Photography:

Dance Open America will provide professional photography and video of each competitor's performance for purchase. No personal flash photography or videotaping will be permitted inside the competition venue. If photography or videotaping is identified, DOA reserves the right to confiscate the camera/video equipment and disqualify the competitor's performance.

Release Agreement:

By signing the Dance Open America Release Agreement, all registered competitors grant permission to Dance Open America and its representatives to publish their photographs/videos on local or national television, promotional videos, marketing materials, the internet, or any other visual media, as deemed fit by Dance Open America in an effort to promote its competitions.

All photographs/videos taken by Dance Open America and any independent representative commissioned by Dance Open America become the property of Dance Open America.

Dance Open America reserves the right to sell said photographs/videos at competition events and online for purchase of DVD or by download.

In addition, all representatives, staff, or kin of Dance Open America is released and held harmless from any and all claims for damages or injuries sustained while participating or attending any activity related to any and all Dance Open America events.

Additional Information:

To register, you can use your account with Dance Comp Genie. If you do not have an account, you must open an account before registering. Verify that all the data is entered correctly. After completing the registration, including the payment section, you will receive a confirmation email to the email address provided in your Dance Comp Genie account.

Dance Open America reserves the rights to change, delete, or add to any rules, regulations, or policies at any time deemed necessary. All changes to original submitted entries must be in writing; no verbal requests will be honored. Changes to original entries must be received seven (7) days before the competition event. Dance Open America requests any questions regarding schedule changes should be submitted by the Studio Directors.

Dance Open America reserves the right to cancel any event due to lack of registration, weather, or other unforeseen circumstance and reserves the right, when necessary, to relocate a competition site/date/time or expand a competition to a multiple day event if necessary. If an extenuating weather or unforeseen circumstance arises and Dance Open America cancels an event and it is not rescheduled, refunds or credits for the following year will be issued. If the event is rescheduled, no refunds will be given. Should an extenuating circumstance arise, please check the website and/or your email address that you registered under for any event updates.

In addition, Dance Open America and the venue hosting the event are not responsible for any personal injury or property loss that is suffered by anyone attending or participating in the competition.
